#### **About This Center**

ELS Los Angeles County – La Verne Center is in the quaint city of La Verne, California, a safe and small city just east of Los Angeles. The ELS Los Angeles County - La Verne Center is located on the University of La Verne campus. ELS students will receive an ID card, just like ULV students, and can use this to access all facilities within the university. Students can also choose to live at the University of La Verne on-campus residence -- an accommodation option that provides convenient access to classes and university amenities, all steps from the city of La Verne's shops and restaurants in the downtown core.

#### **University of La Verne**

University of La Verne is a private university founded in 1891, with a total of about 8,500 students, about 2,500 undergraduates and about 650 international students. The campus covers 103 acres and is in La Verne, a 40-minute drive from downtown Los Angeles (LA). La Verne is a small town developed around the University of La Verne, so students can study in a friendly community and enjoy a welcoming, student-centered atmosphere. The University of La Verne offers 55 undergraduate programs and 19 master's programs. Upon successful completion of ELS Level 112, students will fulfill the English language entry requirement for conditional and direct admission to undergraduate or master's degree programs at the University of La Verne, without official English scores such as TOEFL and IELTS.








About the City and Region - La Verne, California







La Verne is a safe and small city that is located about 45 minutes east of Los Angeles. It is located near beautiful and iconic beaches and attractions such as Disneyland, Universal Studios Hollywood, and popular museums. The University of La Verne campus is located steps from La Verne's city center in a quaint residential community full of small shops, cafes and restaurants. La Verne provides a friendly, small-town atmosphere and has a good public transportation system.

#### **Distances to Nearby Cities**

- Los Angeles: 45 minutes by car, 1 hour and 30 minutes by train
- Hollywood: 45 minutes by car, 2 hours by Train & Bus
- Santa Monica: 1 hour by car
- Santa Barbara, San Diego: 2 hours by car

#### **Area Attractions**

- Old Town Pasadena, Santa Monica, Huntington Gardens, City Walk and Ontario Mills.
- · Universal Studios, Disneyland, Knott's Berry Farms, Six Flags Magic Mountain, and Los Angeles Zoo
- Downtown Los Angeles and Hollywood, Beverly Hills, and many great beaches

#### **Local Transportation**

- There are no shuttle buses operating within the ULV campus. Most students commute on foot or by bicycle.
- Local buses serve the local La Verne vicinity and cost about \$1.00 per ride or \$35 per month for a bus pass.
- Students can use the Metrolink train from the Pomona North station in nearby Pomona (3 km) to go to Los Angeles Union Station (\$9.50 roundtrip on weekends) and beaches (\$16.25 roundtrip on weekends)

Minimum Age: 15

#### Check-in Time

Students should contact their host family prior to their arrival date and let them know what time they expect to arrive at the homestay.

#### **Check-out Time**

Saturday, 8:00am - 12:00pm

On check-out day, students need to: - Return the key to the host family - Take all personal belongings with them – Throw any unwanted items in the trash.




#### **University of La Verne Residence – The OAKS(On-Campus)**





- Room Type: Double occupancy
- Meals: 7 meals per week (1 meal per day breakfast, lunch or dinner)
- Distances from homestay to ELS Center: five-minutes' walk
- Minimum Age: 17
- All rooms are double occupancy and include 2 single beds, 2 desks, 2 dressers, and 2 closets. There is a
  centralized kitchen with a refrigerator and microwave. Self-service laundry machines are available. Linens
  are provided. Upon arrival, students will receive extra long twin sheets, a blanket/comforter, pillow, and a
  towel.
- Males and females may NOT share the same room in the dorm; however, males and females are housed
  on the same floor.
- Free Wi-Fi access is available for all students

#### Check-in Time

9:00am - 8:00pm on the Sunday before the session start date.

Please call the Resident Advisor (RA) on Duty (the number is posted on the window next to the entrance) once you arrive to the Oaks Residence Hall and they will assist you with the check-in process. You will be issued your room keys and a bedding package upon arrival.

#### University of La Verne Residence -Vista Hall

All students who choose the residence option will be assigned to The OAKS upon arrival, in their first session. If space is available in Citrus Hall or Vista Hall in the middle of the session, students may change their residence at no additional charge.



- Room Type: Double occupancy
- Meals: No meals included
- Distance from homestay to ELS Center: five-minutes' walk
- Minimum Age: 17
- The university residence offers apartment living experience without a kitchen. Each suite has 4 bedrooms, a living room and 4 bathrooms. Each bedroom is shared between 2 students, and each room has 2 single beds, 2 desks, and 2 closets. Students share the bathroom with another student who shares the same room.
- Men and women may NOT share a room but may live in the same apartment.
- There is a common lounge, common kitchen, common study room, and coin laundry.
- Free Wi-Fi access is available for all students

#### **University of La Verne Residence – Citrus Hall**

All students who choose the residence option will be assigned to The OAKS upon arrival, in their first session. If space is available in Citrus Hall or Vista Hall in the middle of the session, students may change their residence at no additional charge.





- Room Type: Double occupancy
- Meals: No meals included
- Distances from homestay to ELS Center: a five-minute walk
- Minimum Age: 17
- There are two single beds, two desks, and two closets in the room, and you can use the public restroom located in the hallway. Citrus Hall offers convenient living, with the Spot Dining Hall student cafeteria in the same building.
- Men and women may NOT share a room but may live in the same apartment.
- There is a common lounge, common kitchen, common study room, and coin laundry.
- Free Wi-Fi access is available for all students

# **College Class Visitation**

Class Visitation allows student to visit a university class at the ELS Center's Host university. Student may only be allowed to visit a particular university class a set number of times. Student cannot receive college credit for university course completion.

Students may be eligible to take university classes upon completion of an ELS level in Intensive English. Levels and credits awarded vary among Host Institutions. Typically, students at the Advanced level or Master level 110 or higher can attend university classes

Students will be able to attend certain classes at the Host university and will be able to start by requesting this option from the Center's Academic Director when they reach the required ELS level.

(However, the class professor will make the final decision on whether to accept the student.)

(Additional costs are incurred for each class, and detailed costs should be checked with the Center Director or Academic Director.)

#### **ELS Core Classes**

#### Structure and Speaking Practice (SSP)

SSP classes focus on speaking, listening and structure (grammar). Every student in Levels 101-109 takes SSP.

#### Language Technology Center (LTC)

In the LTC, students study on computers at their own pace with the help of the LTC instructor. LTC supports what students are learning in other classes and can be especially helpful in improving listening, comprehension, grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation.

#### **Skills Enhancement**

These classes focus on a variety of language skills and cover a range of topics to help students improve specific areas of language development. Examples of Skills Enhancement Classes include Pronunciation, Vocabulary Development, Idioms, Conversation, and more.

#### Language Studies (LS)

This class focuses on listening, speaking and critical thinking skills. Every student in Levels 110-112 takes LS.

#### Reading and Writing (RW)

This class focuses on improving reading and writing. All Intensive English students take two periods of Reading and Writing in the afternoon, Monday-Thursday.

# **Programs - Intensive English Program [REG]**

- 30Lessons/week (25 Hours/week)

Intensive English is our most comprehensive program, providing the highest level of proficiency for language learning. The curriculum is designed help students succeed by focusing on all elements of the language: listening, speaking, reading, writing, pronunciation, grammar, and vocabulary. Most students taking this program study with a plan to go to community college or university after completing ELS.

You must take this program to get the ELS level certificate required by the university.

# **Programs - Semi-Intensive English Program [SEM]**

- 20Lessons/week (16.7 Hours/week)

The Semi-Intensive English program allows students to learn English and get a true cultural experience at the same time. These classes are typically scheduled during morning hours and focus on all aspects of language and communication learning, including listening, vocabulary, grammar, and pronunciation. The classes are structured to provide speaking practice and tailored for real-world applications to give you the confidence to use your learning in social settings and in interactions with other students.

# **Programs - American Explorer Program (ACP)**

- \* This program is not available to F-1 students.
- 15 Lessons/week (12.5 Hours/week)

Students who wish to study English while on vacation in the USA may do so in the ELS American Explorer program. This program features three morning lessons per day (Monday-Friday) for a total of 15 lessons per week. Afternoons are free for recreation and relaxation.

The American Explorer part-time program is cultural in nature and does not award certificates of language proficiency. Since the core class schedule may vary by Center and session, 15-hour students may have different programs at different Centers or in different sessions. The American Explorer program consists of 12 levels of instruction from Beginner to Masters, with four weeks of instruction per level.
