

Eckerd College is a private liberal arts college founded in 1958. Total student population is approximately 2,000 students on a spacious 188-acre campus. The campus lies on the shores of the Gulf of Mexico so you can enjoy the nature and weather of St. Petersburg, which is warm and sunny all year round. Eckerd College offers more than 40 undergraduate majors, and is famous for marine science, environmental studies, and animal behavioral sciences. Students enjoy free access to the private campus beach and water sports such as boating, kayaking, and paddleboarding. If you successfully complete ELS 112 level, you can enter undergraduate programs without an official English score such as TOEFL or IELTS, and scholarships are available for international students.

About the City and Region – St. Petersburg, Florida



St. Petersburg is known as the Sunshine City because of its clear, sunny, year-round weather. The St. Petersburg – Clearwater – Tampa Bay region attracts many tourists and Americans relocating from Northern cities like New York, Boston, and Chicago. Outdoor sports such as golf, tennis, fishing, swimming, boating, and cycling are very popular. The city also hosts the Tampa Bay Rays baseball team, world-famous Salvador Dali Museum, the Chihuly Glass Pavilion and museums of Fine Art and Science & Industry. Located just 30 minutes from Tampa and about 90 minutes from Orlando, students can also enjoy major attractions like Disney World (6 theme parks), Universal Studios (3 parks), Sea World, Busch Gardens, and professional soccer, ice hockey and basketball.

- Premium shopping and outlet malls, many concerts, theaters, fine dining, and nightlife venues


Local Transportation

Housing

Homestay



- Room Type: Single occupancy
- Meals: 14 meals per week (Breakfast and Dinner)
- Distance from homestay to ELS Center: Average 15minutes by car (Maximum 1 hour)
 - Some are within walking distance; if walking is not possible, the homestay will provide rides to and from school Monday-Friday.
- Minimum Age: 16

You will live in the host's home, practice your English, and experience authentic American culture. All hosts are background checked and homestays regularly visited by the Center's onsite Homestay Coordinator.



Eckerd College Residence - Sigma (On-Campus)



- Room Type: Double occupancy
- Meals: 19 per week at 2 on-campus cafeterias (Starbucks also available) (summer meal plans may vary)
- Distances to ELS Center: one-minute's walk
- Minimum Age: 18 Maximum Age: 25
- This is a dorm room with 1 large bedroom and 1 bathroom shared by 2 students
- Each student is provided with a bed, desk, and wardrobe
- Males and females may not share the same room; males and females are housed on the same floor
- There is a common lounge and kitchen facilities in the housing complex
- Laundry facilities are available in the dormitory. Small fees may apply to wash and dry.
- Free Wi-Fi access is available for all students
- Registration required for minimum 8 weeks with move-in on a published session start date
- <u>Immunizations are required for this housing</u> (no immunizations for homestay or class attendance)

College Class Visitation

Class Visitation allows students to observe classes at Eckerd College. Students are only allowed to visit specific classes and for a set number of times. Student cannot receive college credit for university course completion.

Students may be eligible to audit university classes upon completion of an ELS level in Intensive English. Levels and credits awarded vary among Host Institutions. Typically, students at the Advanced level or Master level 110 or higher can attend university classes

Students must request this option from the Center's Academic Director when they reach the required ELS level. Eckerd College will make the final decision on whether to accept the student and to observe/audit which classes. Additional costs may be incurred in some cases and cost information will be provided by the Academic Director.

Upon completion of Advanced levels, students can:

- Level 109 Communicate effectively in most social situations.
- Level 108 Understand and can use a wide range of idioms.
- Level 107 Participate fully in most conversations. Equivalent to CEFR: B2 upon completion of ELS Level 109 Education option upon completion: Enter a two-year college.

INTERMEDIATE

Upon completion of Intermediate levels, students can:

- Level 106 Communicate facts and opinions.
- Level 105 Understand most questions and statements at normal speaking speed.
- Level 104 Carry on conversations with native speakers
 - Equivalent to CEFR: B1 upon completion of ELS Level 106

Upon completion of Beginner levels, students can:

- Level 103 Communicate at a basic level in everyday situations.

ELS Core Classes

Structure and Speaking Practice (SSP)

SSP classes focus on speaking, listening and structure (grammar). Every student in Levels 101-109 takes SSP.

Language Technology Center (LTC)

In the LTC, students study on computers at their own pace with the help of the LTC instructor. LTC supports what students are learning in other classes and can be especially helpful in improving listening, comprehension, grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation.

Skills Enhancement

These classes focus on a variety of language skills and cover a range of topics to help students improve specific areas of language development. Examples of Skills Enhancement Classes include Pronunciation, Vocabulary Development, Idioms, Conversation and more.

Language Studies (LS)

This class focuses on listening, speaking and critical thinking skills. Every student in Levels 110-112 takes LS.

Reading and Writing (RW)

This class focuses on improving reading and writing All Intensive English students take two periods of Reading and Writing in the afternoon, Monday-Thursday.

Programs - Intensive English Program [REG]

- 30Lessons/week (25 Hours/week)

Intensive English is our most comprehensive program, providing the highest level of proficiency for language learning. The curriculum is designed help students succeed by focusing on all elements of the language: listening, speaking, reading, writing, pronunciation, grammar, and vocabulary. Most students taking this program study with a plan to go to community college or university after completing ELS.

You must take this program to get the ELS level certificate required by the university.

Programs - Semi-Intensive English Program [SEM]

- 20Lessons/week (16.7 Hours/week)

The Semi-Intensive English program allows students to learn English and get a true cultural experience at the same time. These classes are typically scheduled during morning hours and focus on all aspects of language and communication learning, including listening, vocabulary, grammar, and pronunciation. The classes are structured to provide speaking practice and tailored for real-world applications to give you the confidence to use your learning in social settings and in interactions with other students.

Programs - American Explorer Program (ACP)

* This program is not available to F-1 students.

- 15Lessons/week (12.5 Hours/week)

Students who wish to study English while on vacation in the USA may do so in the ELS American Explorer program. This program features three morning lessons per day (Monday-Friday) for a total of 15 lessons per week. Afternoons are free for recreation and relaxation.

The American Explorer part-time program is cultural in nature and does not award certificates of language proficiency. Since the core class schedule may vary by Center and session, 15-hour students may have different programs at different Centers or in different sessions. The American Explorer program consists of 12 levels of instruction from Beginner to Masters, with four weeks of instruction per level.
