ELS/Houston is located 10-15 minutes by bus from the UST campus.

About the City and Region – Houston, TX



Houston, located in southeastern Texas, is a port city with the largest population and the most developed energy industry in Texas. The city itself is dynamic with a population of about 2.3 million and a population of 7 million when combined with the metropolitan area. It is the fourth most populous city in the United States after New York, Los Angeles, and Chicago. You can enjoy weekend visits to the National Air and Space Administration (NASA) Space Center Houston, Gulf of Mexico beaches and much more.

Homestay



- Room Type: Single occupancy
- Meals: 14 meals per week (Breakfast and Dinner)
- Distance from homestay to ELS Center: Average 45minutes (Maximum 1 hour 30 minutes)
- Minimum Age: 16

* Students younger than stated minimum might be considered upon request. Approval must first be obtained from the Center Director before confirming.

Students are placed in single occupancy rooms and may share a bathroom with other family members or students. Travel time to/from homestays vary but generally take anywhere from 45 - 60 minutes via Houston's Metro bus system. Homestay students are responsible for their own transportation to/from ELS/Houston.

Check-in Time

8:00am - 10:00pm Sunday before session start date.

Homestay students should notify their homestay hosts or ELS of their arrival times so that the hosts will know to be home when the students arrive.

Check-out Time

8:00am - 1:00pm Saturday after session end date Students will arrange their check out with their homestay host and the homestay coordinator. Rooms should be left clean and tidy.



ELS Houston Residence - Kimpton Apartments (Off-campus)

- Room Type: Double occupancy
- Meals: No meals included
- Distance to ELS Center: About 10-15 minutes by Metro Bus
- Minimum Age: 18
- An apartment style accommodation with 2 bedrooms, 2 bathrooms, kitchen and living space. The room is shared by 2 students.
- Common spaces include an outdoor swimming pool, fitness center, and common lounge.
- Males and females may cannot live in the same apartment.
- Washers and dryers are located in each apartment with no charge.
- Free Wi-Fi access is available for all students

Upon completion of master's levels, students can:

- Level 112 Speak and understand English with ease.
- Level 111 Read and write with sufficient proficiency to satisfy professional and university requirements.
- Level 110 Conduct business competently in English Equivalent to CEFR: B2+/C1 upon completion of ELS Level 112 Education option upon completion: Begin an undergraduate or graduate degree program.

ADVANCED

Upon completion of Advanced levels, students can:

- Level 109 Communicate effectively in most social situations.
- Level 108 Understand and can use a wide range of idioms.
- Level 107 Participate fully in most conversations. Equivalent to CEFR: B2 upon completion of ELS Level 109 Education option upon completion: Enter a two-year college.

INTERMEDIATE

Upon completion of Intermediate levels, students can:

- Level 106 Communicate facts and opinions.
- Level 105 Understand most questions and statements at normal speaking speed.
- Level 104 Carry on conversations with native speakers
 - Equivalent to CEFR: B1 upon completion of ELS Level 106

BEGINNER

Upon completion of Beginner levels, students can:

- Level 103 Communicate at a basic level in everyday situations.
- Level 102 Understand English when spoken slowly and clearly.

ELS Core Classes

Structure and Speaking Practice (SSP)

SSP classes focus on speaking, listening and structure (grammar). Every student in Levels 101-109 takes SSP.

Language Technology Center (LTC)

In the LTC, students study on computers at their own pace with the help of the LTC instructor. LTC supports what students are learning in other classes and can be especially helpful in improving listening, comprehension, grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation.

Skills Enhancement

These classes focus on a variety of language skills and cover a range of topics to help students improve specific areas of language development. Examples of Skills Enhancement Classes include Pronunciation, Vocabulary Development, Idioms, Conversation and more.

Language Studies (LS)

This class focuses on listening, speaking and critical thinking skills. Every student in Levels 110-112 takes LS.

Reading and Writing (RW)

This class focuses on improving reading and writing All Intensive English students take two periods of Reading and Writing in the afternoon, Monday-Thursday.

Programs - Intensive English Program [REG]

- 30 Lessons/week (30 class hours/week) (class hour is defined as 50 minutes of instruction with a 10-minute break)

Intensive English is our most comprehensive program, providing the highest level of proficiency for language learning. The curriculum is designed help students succeed by focusing on all elements of the language: listening, speaking, reading, writing, pronunciation, grammar, and vocabulary. Most students taking this program study with a plan to go to community college or university after completing ELS.

You must take this program to get the ELS level certificate required by the university.

Programs - Semi-Intensive English Program [SEM]

- 20 Lessons/week (20 class hours/week) (class hour is defined as 50 minutes of instruction with a 10-minute break)

The Semi-Intensive English program allows students to learn English and get a true cultural experience at the same time. These classes are typically scheduled during morning hours and focus on all aspects of language and communication learning, including listening, vocabulary, grammar, and pronunciation. The classes are structured to provide speaking practice and tailored for real-world applications to give you the confidence to use your learning in social settings and in interactions with other students.

Programs - American Explorer Program (ACP)

* This program is not available to F-1 students.

- 15 Lessons/week (15 class hours/week) (class hour is defined as 50 minutes of instruction with a 10-minute break)

Students who wish to study English while on vacation in the USA may do so in the ELS American Explorer program. This program features three morning lessons per day (Monday-Friday) for a total of 15 lessons per week. Afternoons are free for recreation and relaxation.

The American Explorer part-time program is cultural in nature and does not award certificates of language proficiency. Since the core class schedule may vary by Center and session, 15-hour students may have different programs at different Centers or in different sessions. The American Explorer program consists of 12 levels of instruction from Beginner to Masters, with four weeks of instruction per level.
