SEAMLESS ENTRY

For students wishing to take advantage of our ILSC University Pathway Program seamless entry (no IELTS or TOEFL test required), we recommend registering for two sessions of our Full Time Intensive schedule following the completion of your ILSC High School Program: Fast Track to Higher Education Program.

DESCRIPTION

Earn six integral high school course credits online, while gaining the language ability and academic skills needed to succeed. In addition to earning six (6) internally recognized high school credits through TVO ILC and ILSC's language classes, you will also receive University and College application support on your academic journey. Credit courses may include:

- English (ENG4U)
- Mathematics of Data Management (MDM4U)
- Calculus and Vectors (MCV4U)
- Advanced Functions (MHF4U)
- Science (SNC4M)
- Physics (SPH4U)
- Earth and Space Sciences (SES4U)
- Chemistry (SCH4U)
- Biology (SBI4U)
- And more

THE SUPPORT YOU NEED TO SUCCEED

In addition to daily ILSC English for Academic Purposes (EAP) classes, and dedicated time slots for independent study of the online high school credit material, students receive a range of support services to ensure their success:

- Customized learning plans
- Progress monitoring: attend one-on-one language-specific meetings and receive weekly small group support and check-in sessions with ILSC
- Academic skills building through free online practice resources
- Intensive training for lecture comprehension, note taking, research and academic discussions
- Educational counseling sessions with ILSC's University Pathways teams
- One-on-one guidance for choosing a partner college or university (available in multiple languages)
- Post-secondary application support
- Six full credit courses (each course equals one credit with an estimated 110 hours of study per credit required)
