ILSC HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAM: FOUNDATION YEAR (IN-SCHOOL)

- Learn Academic English at ILSC and build important foundational skills for success in a Canadian or Australian college, TAFE, or university.
- Earn your high school diploma from Ontario's Ministry of Education through TVO ILC.
- Complete 8 full credit courses* in just 40 weeks and get ready for your next step applying to a
 post-secondary institution in Canada or abroad.
- Blended learning program includes ILSC courses delivered in school and a set study block to complete TVO ILC's online high school credit program in ILSC's computer labs.

DESCRIPTION

Earn a High School diploma that's recognized throughout Canada through online study, while gaining the language ability and academic skills needed to succeed through in class language training. Through the successful completion of this program, students will receive a total of 8 high school credits, earning their Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). The OSSD is recognized by post-secondary institutions in Canada, the U.K., the U.S., Australia, New Zealand, among other countries. This allows our students access to a wider range of post-secondary institutions as they pursue their academic goals. Possible courses may include:

THE SUPPORT YOU NEED TO SUCCEED

In addition to daily ILSC English for Academic Purposes (EAP) classes, and dedicated time slots for independent study of the online high school credit material, students receive a range of support services to ensure their success:

- Progress monitoring: attend one-on-one language-specific meetings and receive weekly small group support and check-in sessions with
- Academic skills building through free online practice resources
- Intensive training for lecture comprehension, note taking, research and academic discussions

- Eight full credit courses (each course equals one credit with an estimated 110 hours of study per credit required)
